Novena of Prayer
Ascension – Pentecost 2021

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Introduction

The disciples in the upper room, after the Ascension and before Pentecost knew their task. They were to go into the whole world telling the Good News of the Risen Jesus, baptising those who believed. They were to be 'witnesses' or, in the Greek, 'martyrs'. This was a dangerous business.

Anyone who believed could join in – people of any race, language, nationality, religion or gender: all were welcome.

But what did they talk about? One seemed doubtful until he had a great revelation which turned his heart, another had denied it all. The treasurer had committed suicide and the books were in a mess. There was no way they could go into the outside world - it was too dangerous to go outside the upper room. After all, they were the chosen ones. Who would do the work if they were killed?

The Upper Room must have felt so safe, so comfortable. It was in that room that Jesus had given them the Eucharist. At least they could be obedient in doing that. Maybe others would come from outside and join them?

Then something extraordinary happened. They were overcome by wind and fire, the ancient symbols of God's presence. That energy and confidence, thrust them out into the street, with such exuberance that they were accused of being drunk in the middle of the morning.

All this had been promised. The fears and doubts, those objections to Jesus' command evaporated. The Church was on the move. It was meant to be on the move. It wasn't meant for upper rooms, but for the village, the city, the countryside – for people and places everywhere. The Holy Spirit wasn't given so individuals could form an elite group to practice a private religion. The Holy Spirit was given to the Church to enable it to be the Church. In its power, the Church is enabled to put things together and to be together.

The Holy Spirit doesn't guarantee that everything we do together is wise or good. The Holy Spirit guarantees that the Church and the Church's mission will go on and on until God's Kingdom comes. The Holy Spirit shows us Jesus and brings us to the Father. The Holy Spirit moves in the waters of baptism; in the bread and wine of the eucharist, in the oil of healing and renewal; and in our prayer, private and corporate. The Holy Spirit drives us out of the safety and security of our upper rooms and pushes us beyond ourselves.

In these days you are invited to join with Christians across the world as we pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit in our lives and in our world. Each day of the Novena has a particular theme, and you might like to use this as a particular point of reflection through the day. In prayer we are drawn closer together. May this holy time be one of blessing for us all.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love.

Light & Dark

And when people are puzzled at what you are doing, find ways - fresh ways - of telling the story of the return of the human race from its exile, and use those stories as your explanation.
